McKINNEY FAMILY CEMETERY

Visited February 24, 1973. The following inscription was found on a small metal plate on a very large box-type grave made of five slabs of steel-reinforced concrete. It was located on the top of a hill about 300 yards northwest of a home at 8796 Shelby Drive.

Dr. Alexander Findlay McKinney Born March 14, 1845 Died September 7, 1918

The compilers were told that Dr. McKinney was buried in this large vault with his favorite horse and dog. The area did not appear to contain other burials. Elmwood Cemetery, a book published by the cemetery in 1874, shows Lot No. 187, Fowler Section, 672 square feet, as owned by the estate of Dr. A.F. McKinney.

The Commercial Appeal, Sept. 8, 1918, Page 17: Dr. A.F. McKinney of Forest Hill, died yesterday on the old homestead ... where he was born ... former family slaves will be pallbearers ... Confederate veteran ... two of his brothers killed in that conflict ... raiser of thoroughbred cattle ... retired from practice of medicine 10 years ago ... survived by his widow, Mrs. Florence McKinney.

A Mr. Blakey of Rosemark, Tenn., told the compilers that the true name of Bethel Church Cemetery was the Elbethel Primitive Baptist Church Cemetery. When a young lad he visited that church with his father one time, and has lived nearby ever since. He said the church location was on the old Gregory farm in early days.
