

CEMETERY IN THE FRAYSER AREA

Visited March 8, 1970. The name of this cemetery is not known. It is located on the property of Mr. Harry Lee Minor, 1990 Jan Drive in the Frayser area of Memphis. Mr. Minor's family has owned the property since 1908 when it was purchased from Oscar Winston. It was part of the Jacob Tipton place.

Mr. Minor, who was 85, is a son of James Madison Minor and his wife Eldorado Able, 1859 - 1943, one of 13 children of Jesse H. and Mary (Ritchie) Able. Mary Ritchie Able was born in 1816. Mr. Minor's sister, Mrs. Max Darrow of Jonesboro, Arkansas, has the family bibles. The Able and Ritchie families moved to Shelby County from Jasper and Selma, Alabama. Mr. Minor's great-aunt, his mother's aunt, was Miss Mary Able, one of the three wives of I.Y. Gibson, all of whom were buried in old Winchester Cemetery where there was one large monument for him and his three wives. Mr. Minor's aunt, his Mother's sister, Clara Able, married "Yankee" Captain Oliver Fitzsimmons Walters and is buried in Raleigh Cemetery. Four of Mr. Minor's uncles, his Mother's brothers, fought in the Civil War. Mr. Minor said there was no connection between his family and the persons buried in the cemetery on his property.
