NEWSPAPER CLIPPING

Workmen, excavating for an addition to The Commercial Appeal's building on Union, were confronted with a mystery yesterday when they dug up a time-worn tombstone bearing the name of Lizzie Messinger, as the paper reported October 5, 1948. At the top of the three-foot stone was carved a reclining lion, and under this were the letters and figures of "R", "G", "F", "09".

Lizzie Messinger Faithful member of The Humble Seeker Circle 177-Died Aug. 24, 1819

(Editor's note: It seems unlikely anyone would have died in Memphis/Shelby County in 1819 (date of founding) and had a large carved tombstone unless it was set later as a memorial or moved to this area.)
