Up the Highway of Life another class goes,

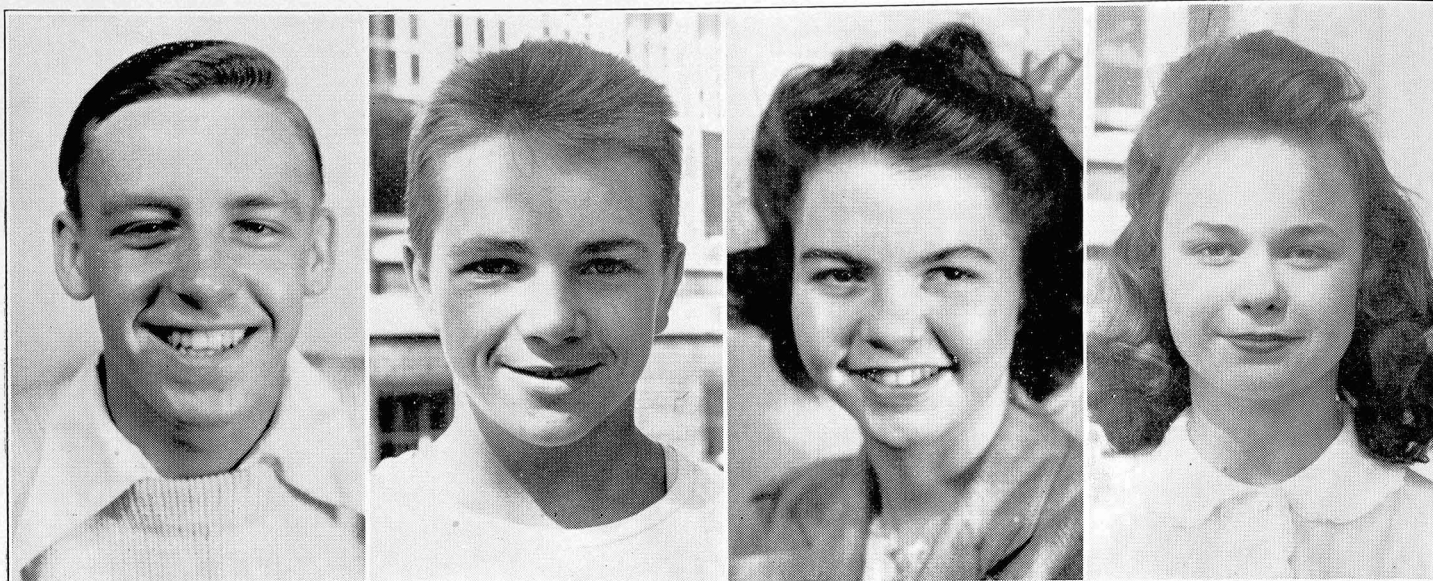

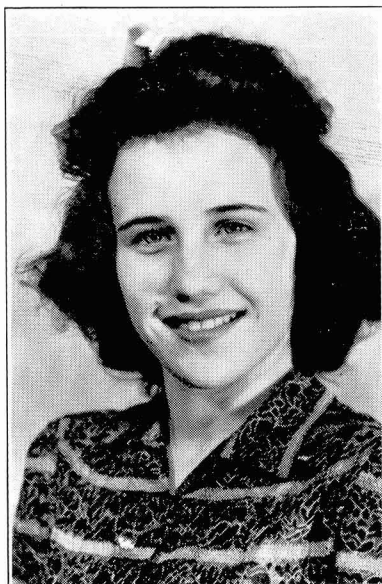

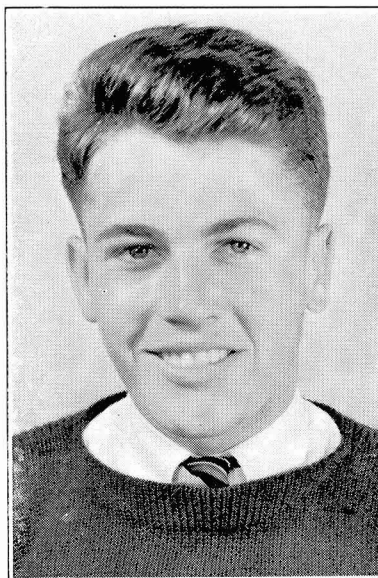

JACK CALLICOTT was mayor of the school, and captain of the football team. He made the "All Memphis." He was elected most popular and friendliest boy.

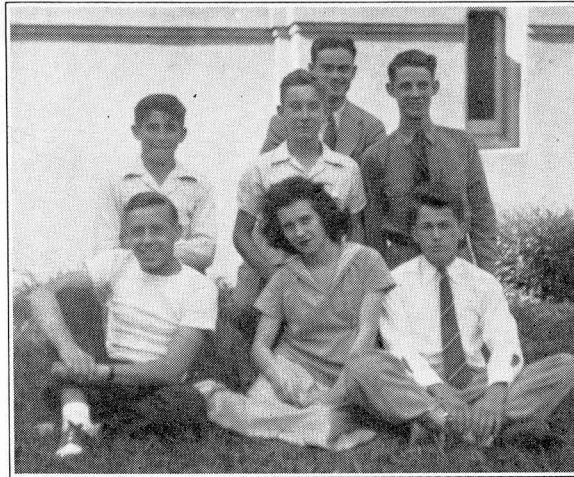
ROBERT THORNTON was a member of the football team. He was also elected the best dancer and the biggest flirt in his home room.

The second is Louie Hansberger, who made honorable mention. Louie is an excellent defense man, also having a good eye for the basket.

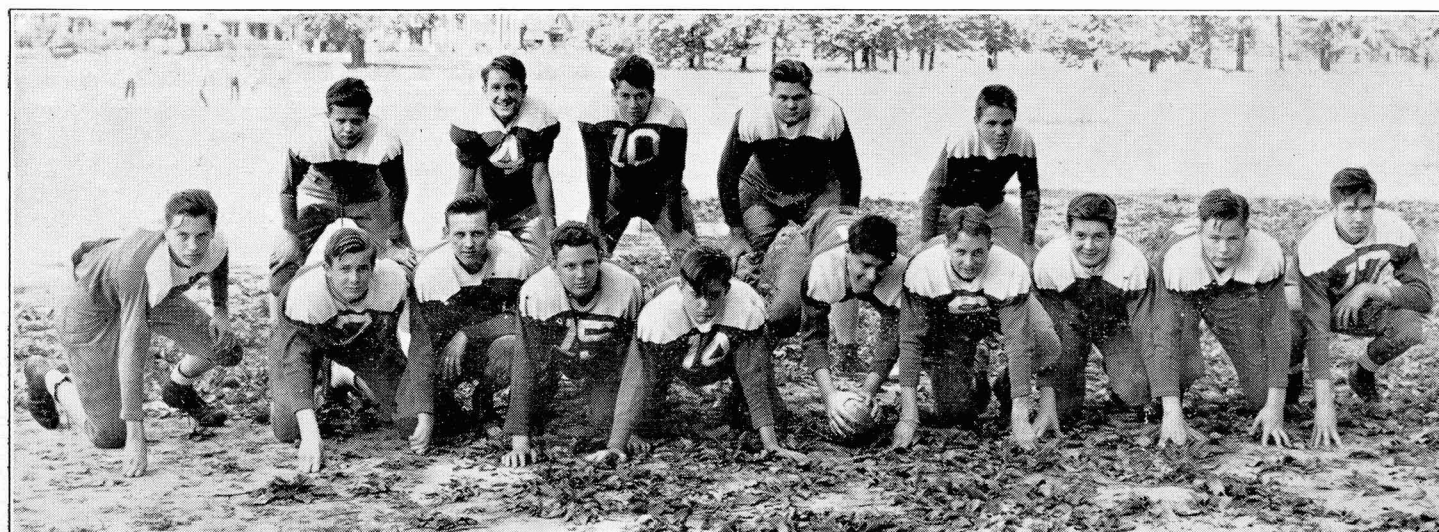

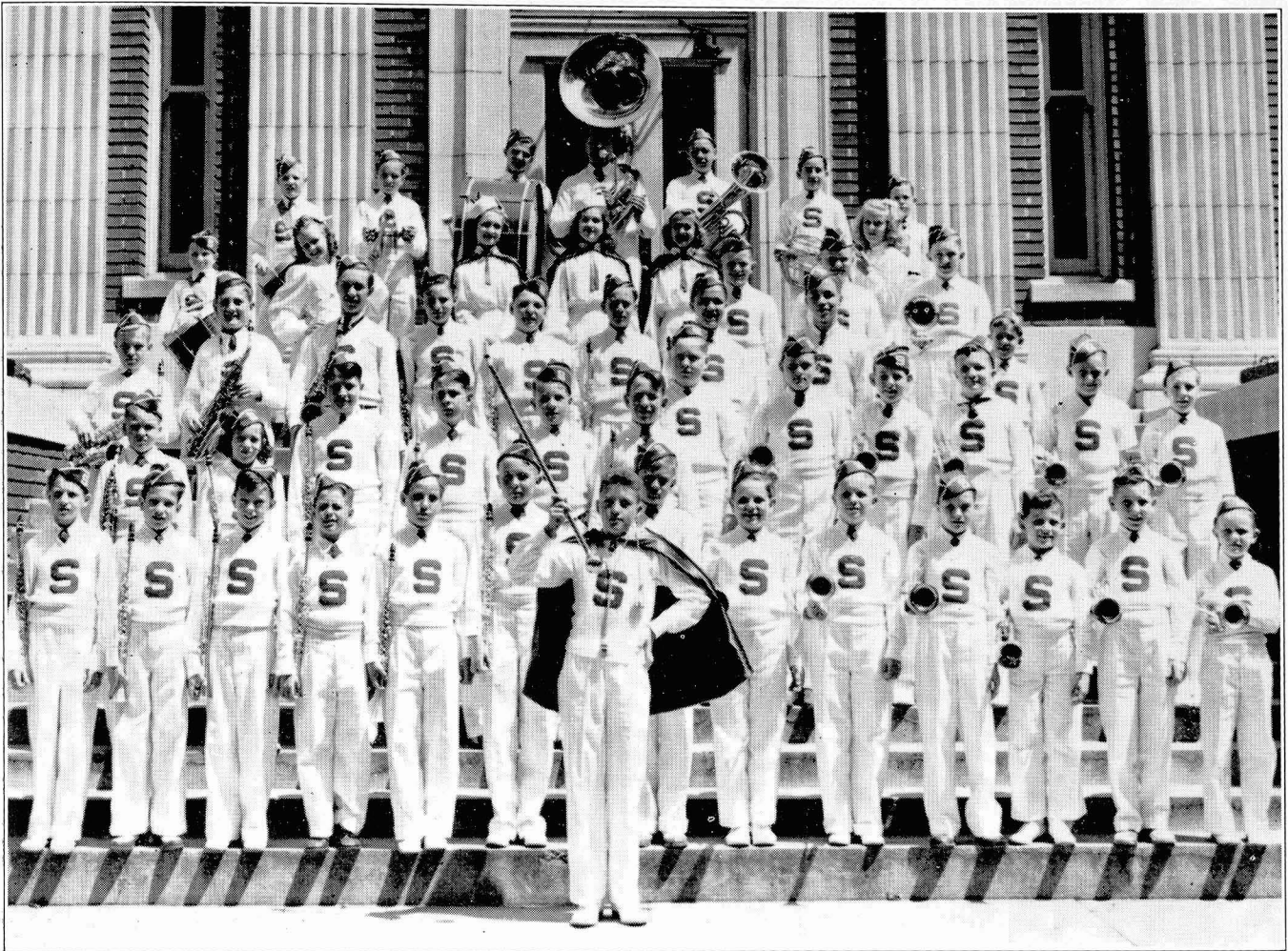
